The Waiting List



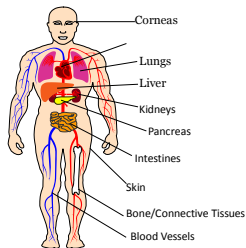

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Donation Process



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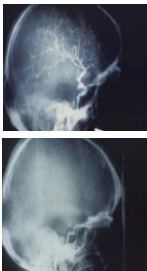
Brain Death

Patient may look like they are sleeping

- Heart is beating
- Chest is moving
- Patient is warm
- Skin has color
- Continues to be monitored



No outward evidence of death



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Donation after Circulatory Death (DCD)

1. Patient does not meet neurological criteria for death
2. End-of-life decisions are occurring (withdrawing life-sustaining treatment)
1. Patient is likely to die within a short time frame (collaborative evaluation)

Donor Designation

Donor designation is the practice of honoring the donor’s lifetime, documented, decision to be an organ, eye and tissue donor.
